## **ROAD TRAFFIC REGULATION ACT 1984**

THE A101 GLA ROAD (ROTHERHITHE TUNNEL, LONDON BOROUGH OF TOWER HAMLETS AND SOUTHWARK) (VARIOUS PROHIBITIONS AND RESTRICTIONS) CONSOLIDATION ORDER 2012 VARIATION **ORDER 2019** 

- 1. Transport for London hereby gives notice that on 18th April 2019 it made the above named Order, under section 6 of the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1984. The Order will come into force on 1st May 2019.
- 2. The general nature and effect of the Order will be to amend:
  - (I) the height restriction on the A101 Rotherhithe Tunnel and its approaches from 14 feet 9 inches (4.4 metres) to 6 feet 6 inches (2 metres):
  - (2) the weight restriction on the AIOI Rotherhithe Tunnel and its approaches from 17 tonnes for all vehicles to a maximum gross weight
- 3. The roads which would be affected by the Order are the A101 Rotherhithe Tunnel and its approaches in both the London Boroughs of Tower Hamlets and Southwark.
- 4. A copy of the Order, a statement of Transport for London's reasons for the proposals, a map indicating the location and effect of the Order and copies of any Order revoked, suspended or varied by the Order can be inspected during normal office hours at the offices of:
