existing road humps (known as "speed cushions") in Dalmore Road and Milkwood Road with cycle-friendly "sinusoidal" road humps, to provide new "sinusoidal" road humps in Dalmore Road and Milkwood Road and to remove certain existing "speed cushions" in Dalmore Road. Objections or other comments may be made - see paragraph 5.] 1. NOTICE IS HEREBY GIVEN that the Council of the London

(1) construct new road humps known as "sinusoidal" road humps in:-

- (a) Dalmore Road, (i) outside Nos. 2 and 4 and No. 9; and (ii) outside No. 31 and Nos. 36 and 38:
  - (b) Milkwood Road, outside Nos. 133 and 135;
  - replace the existing road humps (known as
  - cushions") with new "sinusoidal" road humps in:-(a) Dalmore Road, outside Nos. 20 and 22 and No. 21;
- (b) Milkwood Road, (i) outside No. 53; (ii) at the rear of Nos. 33 and 34 Mahatma Gandhi Industrial Estate: and (iii) outside Nos. 155 and 157; (3) remove the existing road humps known as "speed cushions"

in Dalmore Road, (i) outside Nos. 2 and 9; and (ii) outside Nos. 31 and 33 and No. 38. [Each "sinusoidal" road hump would be

- a round-topped, elevated section of carriageway that rises no more than 75 millimetres higher than the existing carriageway, extends across the full width of the carriageway from kerb to kerb and is 3.7 metres long.] 2. The existing road humps in Dalmore Road and Milkwood Road have limited impact on slowing down traffic. The replacement of the speed cushions with new cycle-friendly
- sinusoidal road humps, together with the provision of new sinusoidal road humps is necessary to encourage smoother with pollution-inducing acceleration and driving ess deceleration and improve safety by reducing traffic speeds and the potential for road accidents.
