

LONDON BOROUGH OF LAMBETH
ROAD TRAFFIC REGULATION ACT 1984 – SECTION 14
TEMPORARY ROAD CLOSURES – MONTFORD PLACE
AND KENNINGTON ROAD

1. NOTICE IS HEREBY GIVEN that to enable development related works and power connection works to be carried out, the Council of the London Borough of Lambeth have made an Order the effect of which will be to temporarily ban vehicles from entering:-

- (a) that length of Montford Place which lies between Kennington Lane and the southern wall of the Beefeater Gin Distillery, No. 20 Montford Place (anticipated duration of this road closure will be from 31st August to 1st September 2019, with back-up dates of 7th to 8th September 2019);
- (b) those lengths of Kennington Road (on the south-west side of the Kennington Green London Underground Site) and Montford Place which lie between the main carriageway of Kennington Road (A23) and the common boundary of the rear of No. 362 Kennington Road and the side of No. 1a Montford Place (anticipated duration of this road closure will be from 16th September 2019 for about 3 weeks).

2. Alternative routes for affected vehicles will be available as follows: -

- (a) for the closure of Montford Place described in paragraph 1(a) above, via Kennington Lane, Windmill Row and Kennington Road;
- (b) for the closure of Kennington Road and Montford Place described in paragraph 1(b) above, via Kennington Road, Windmill Row, Kennington Lane and Montford Place (the gate near the junction of the two arms of Montford Place will be open to allow access and egress to properties).

3. The road closures described above will only apply at such times and to such extent as shall be indicated by the placing of the appropriate traffic signs.

4. The Order will come into force on 31st August 2019 and continue for a maximum duration of 4 months (to allow for contingencies) or until the works have been completed, whichever is the sooner. In practice it is anticipated that the Order will only have effect at one of the locations specified in paragraph 1 of this Notice at a time, and during the times specified in brackets next to each of those locations, but if the works cannot be carried out or completed during those times, then the Order may have effect at other times within the maximum duration of 4 months.
