

LICENSING ACT 2003

Application for Variation of Premises Licence

Kimberley Thomas-Currie has applied to the London Borough of Lambeth to vary a Premises Licence, in respect of the following premises:

The Old Vic, The Cut, Waterloo, London, SE1 8NB

The nature of the variation is as follows:

Building works will be complete, removing all temporary changes to exits and entrances. All public entrance/ exit routes into the ground floor stalls auditorium will be back in use. Fire exits from stalls auditorium returned to four in total. New lift installed at ground and basement level to improve wheelchair access to those levels, including box office, toilet facilities and the newly refurbished bar. Access from the Lilian Baylis Circle auditorium to toilets on the 3rd floor reinstated. LFB consulted throughout the build and will return to view the completed works.

Remove the historic condition “the sale of alcohol must be ancillary to the use of the premises for music and dancing and substantial refreshment” which was a condition of the previous special hours certificate under the licensing act 1964, and is no longer relevant. This hasn’t appeared on the licence for the last 13 years but has not been officially removed by variation to date. For clarity, our operating model and opening hours will NOT change as a result of this.

A responsible authority or any other person may make representation to the licensing authority in respect of this application. Representations must be made in writing, either by post to the above address, or by email to licensing@lambeth.gov.uk and must be received no later than 21st August 2019.

It is an offence to knowingly or recklessly make a false statement in connection with a licensing application, and the maximum fine for which a person is liable on summary conviction for that offence shall not exceed level 5 on the standard scale (£5,000).
