waiting restrictions (which are indicated on the road by double yellow lines) in parts of Faygate Road, Hillside Road,

- Hitherfield Road, Lydhurst Avenue and Palace Road.] 1. NOTICE IS HEREBY GIVEN that the Council of the London Borough Lambeth on 2nd March 2020 made the Lambeth (Waiting and Loading Restriction) (Amendment No. 288) Order 2020 under sections 6 and 124 of and Part IV of
- Schedule 9 to the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1984. 2. The general effect of the Order, which will come into force on 9th March 2020, will be to ban waiting by vehicles at any time in the lengths of roads specified in the Schedule to this Notice.
- 3. The Order as originally proposed included a ban on waiting by vehicles in other roads in the Streatham Hill area, as part of wider proposals to introduce a new controlled parking zone known as the Streatham Hill East "M" CPZ. These parts of the original proposals are not going ahead at the present time.
- 4. The introduction of the ban on waiting by vehicles is necessary to improve visibility for drivers and pedestrians and maintain clear access routes at road junctions and vehicle accessways and to assist with general accessibility and improve road safety.

If any person wishes to question the validity of the Order or of any of its provisions on the grounds that it or they are not within the powers conferred by the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1984, or that any requirement of that Act or of

any instrument made under that Act has not been complied with, that person may, within 6 weeks from the date on which

the Order is made, apply for the purpose to the High Court.
