## LONDON BOROUGH OF LAMBETH ROAD TRAFFIC REGULATION ACT 1984 - SECTION 14

SHAKESPEARE ROAD 1. NOTICE IS HEREBY GIVEN that because of a likelihood of danger to the public, the Council of the London Borough of Lambeth have made an order the effect of which will be to temporarily:

TEMPORARY TRAFFIC AND PARKING RESTRICTIONS FOR SAFE DISTANCING IN CONNECTION WITH THE COVID 19 PANDEMIC RESTRICTIONS - ATLANTIC ROAD, RAILTON ROAD, ST. MATTHEW'S ROAD AND

- (a) ban vehicles other than pedal cycles from entering, exiting, proceeding, stopping or waiting (including waiting for the purpose of loading or unloading a vehicle) in:
  - St. Matthews Road, between a point 5 metres north of the northern kerb-line of Hicken Road and a point 45 metres north of that kerb-line: (ii) Shakespeare Road, between a point 2 metres
  - Road and a point 2 metres south-west of the south-western boundary of No. 83 Shakespeare Road: (b) ban vehicles other than buses or pedal cycles from

north-east of the north-eastern kerb-line of Mavall

- entering, exiting, proceeding, stopping or waiting (including waiting for the purpose of loading or unloading a vehicle) in;
- Atlantic Road, between its junction Coldharbour Lane and its junction with Vining Street:
- (ii) Railton Road, between the northern boundary of No. 243 Railton Road and a point 10 metres southeast of the south-eastern boundary of No. 239
- Railton Road: (c) ban vehicles, other than buses or pedal cycles, proceeding southbound in Railton Road at the
- northern boundary of No. 47 Railton Road. [Note: vehicles requiring access to premises within the length of Atlantic Road specified in paragraph (b)(i) above for the purpose of loading or unloading a vehicle will be able to apply to the Council for an exemption to the
- restrictions referred to in that paragraph] 2. Alternative routes will be available for vehicles affected by the bans described in paragraph 1 above, via adjacent

streets as indicated by traffic signs.

- 3. The bans will only apply at such times and to such extent as shall be indicated by the placing and covering of the appropriate traffic signs. They are necessary as a result of an increase in pedestrian and cyclist traffic and movement on the roads affected. This is as a result of the Council's response to the Public Health restrictions on movement. exercise and social distancing in connection to the Covid 19 pandemic.
- 4. The order will come into force on 6th June 2020 and will continue for a maximum duration of 18 months or until the likelihood of danger to the public has diminished to such an extent that the Council considers the provisions of the Order
