THE A3 GLA ROAD (KENNINGTON PARK ROAD) (LONDON BOROUGH OF SOUTHWARK) PRESCRIBED ROUTE TRAFFIC ORDER 2020

1. Transport for London hereby gives notice that on 12th August 2020 it made the above named Orders, under section 6 of the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1984. The Order will come into force 15th August 2020.
2. The general nature and effect of the Orders will be to:
 - (1) prohibit any vehicle except a pedal cycle proceeding in a south-easterly direction on the A3 Kennington Park Road to proceed in any direction other than straight ahead at its junction with Braganza Street;
 - (2) remove a section of the north-eastbound bus lane on the A3 Kennington Park Road between a point 10 metres south-west of its junction with Kennings Way and a point 3 metres south-west of its junction with Othello Close;
 - (3) reduce the length of the parking bay outside Penryn House, No 64 Kennington Park Road by 6.5 metres at its south-western end and extend the bay by 0.5 of a metre at its north-eastern end (its total length will be 9.6 metres), extending the double red lines (No Stopping at Any Time) controls outside Penryn House, No. 64 Kennington Park Road to accommodate the change;
 - (4) reduce the length of the electric taxi charging bay outside Penryn House, No 64 Kennington Park Road by 0.5 of a metre at its south-western end, reduce the underlying double red lines (No Stopping at Any Time) control to accommodate the change.
3. The road which would be affected by the Orders is the A3 Kennington Park Road.
4. 5. Any person wishing to question the validity of the Orders or of any of their provisions on the grounds that they are not within the relevant powers conferred by the Act or that any requirement of the Act has not been complied with, that person may, within six weeks from the date on which the Orders are made, make application for the purpose to the High Court.
