- Transport for London hereby gives notice that on 12th August 2020 it made the above named Order, under section 6 of the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1984. The Order will come into force on 15th August 2020.
- 2020.2. The general nature and effect of the Orders will be to:(1) prohibit all vehicles except pedal cycles from turning right from
 - Stirling Road into the A3 Clapham Road;
 (2) lengthen the loading, unloading and disabled persons' vehicles bay on Union Road at the side of No. 348 Clapham Road (Public House) by 0.5 of a metre and move it 2.5 metres south-eastwards. The No Stopping at Any Time controls (Double Red Lines) will be varied to
- reflect the change.

 3. The roads which would be affected by the Orders are Stirling Road and Union Road.
