REMOVAL OF SCHOOL KEEP CLEAR MARKINGS AND PARKING PLACE AND WAITING AND LOADING AMENDMENTS – CLARENCE CRESCENT

(NOTE: This Notice is about the removal of a school keep clear marking in Clarence Crescent, extending the existing adjacent parking place, the removal of a length of parking space further along this stretch of road and imposing at any time waiting restrictions (indicated by double yellow lines) to enable the construction of a new dropped kerb to enable vehicular access to a new development.)

1. NOTICE IS HEREBY GIVEN that the Council of the London Borough of Lambeth on 23rd September 2020 made the Lambeth (Clapham “L”) (Parking Places) (No. 3) Order 2020, the Lambeth (Waiting and Loading Restriction) (Amendment No. 296) Order 2020 and the Lambeth (Prohibition of Stopping Outside Schools) (Amendment No. 1) Order 2020, under sections 6, 45, 46, 49 and 124 of and Part IV of Schedule 9 to the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1984. The Orders will come into force on 28th September 2020.

2. The general effect of the Orders will be to remove:-

- (a) a length of school keep clear markings in Clarence Crescent which lies approximately 14 metres south-east of Clarence Avenue and extend the existing adjacent shared use parking space by 12 metres;
- (b) a length of shared use parking space opposite Nos. 91 and 92 Clarence Crescent and ban waiting at any time (indicated by double yellow lines) in that length of road instead.

3. The Orders are required to (a) remove an existing school keep clear marking in Clarence Crescent, which is no longer required and extend the adjacent shared use parking space; and (b) remove a length of parking space adjacent to a dropped kerb and impose at any time waiting restrictions in that length of road (indicated by double yellow lines) so as to allow vehicular access to the new development.

A copy of the Orders and other documents giving particulars about the Orders (including a map) would usually be made available for inspection the offices of Lambeth Council's Highways Team (Resident Services), 3rd Floor, Civic Centre, 6 Brixton Hill, London SW2 1EG. However, owing to restrictions relating to the COVID-19 pandemic, this is not currently possible and documents are therefore available for inspection on line at: www.lambeth.gov.uk/traffic-management-orders. 6. If any person wishes to question the validity of the Orders or of any of their provisions on the grounds that it or they are not within the powers conferred by the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1984, or that any requirement of that Act or of any instrument made under that Act has not been complied with, that person may, within 6 weeks from the date on which the Orders are made, apply for the purpose to the High Court.
