Schedule 9 to the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1984, as The Order will come into force on 14th amended.

September 2020 and it will continue indefinitely the provisions of an experimental order that is currently in 2. The general effect of the Order will be to continue to ban motor vehicles from entering the length of Lowden Road that lies between Milkwood Road and Heron Road, during certain times of the day. This will be achieved by

continuing the pedestrian and cycle zone in that length of Lowden Road, and by continuing to place barriers at the junctions of Lowden Road with Milkwood Road and Heron Road (when necessary), between 8 am and 9 am and between 3 pm and 4 pm on Mondays to Fridays, during school term-time. 3. The Order is necessary to continue to promote a pleasant environment that feels safer in the immediate

If any person wishes to question the validity of the Order or of any of its provisions on the grounds that it or they are not within the powers conferred by the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1984, or that any requirement of that Act or of any instrument made under that Act has not been complied with, that person may, within 6 weeks from the date on which the Order is made, apply for the purpose to the High Court.
