Road Traffic Regulation Act 1984

The Lewisham (Manor Lane and Manor Park) (Prescribed Routes) (Covid-19) Temporary Traffic Order 2020

NOTICE IS HEREBY GIVEN that Lewisham Council made this temporary traffic order under the provisions of section 14(1) of the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1984 as amended by The Traffic Orders Procedure (Coronavirus) (Amendment) (England) Regulations 2020 because of the likelihood of danger to the public on and adjacent to the highway, and that it is necessary to make the order for purposes connected to coronavirus so as to encourage walking and cycling and to maintain social distancing on and adjacent to the highway.

The effects of the order are indicated below.

1. (1) Road closure for all motor vehicles in:-

(i) Manor Lane, between a point 14 meters south of the centerline of Fernbrook Road and a point 5 meters southwards thereof; and

(ii) Manor Park, between a point 11 meters south of the centerline of Northbrook Road and a point 5 meters southwards thereof.

(2) The alternative routes for traffic affected by the prohibition in article 1(1)(i) shall be via Southbrook Road, Burnt Ash Hill, Burnt Ash Road, the A205 and Manor Lane, and vice versa, and that for traffic affected by the prohibition in article 1(1)(ii) shall be via Manor Park, Manor Lane, Handen Road, Burnt Ash Road, Lee High Road and Manor Park, and vice versa.

2. The prohibitions in article 1 of this Notice shall not apply to any bus or dial-a-ride vehicle and pedal cycle.

3. The prohibitions described in article 1 shall replace those in The Lewisham (Various Roads) (Covid-19) (Phase 1b) (Temporary Prohibition of Traffic) Order 2020

4. The existing width restriction in Manor Park shall be suspended.

5. Exemption is provided in the order for vehicles being used for ambulance, fire brigade or police purposes in an emergency and anything done with the permission or at the direction of a police officer in uniform, and any vehicle authorised by London Borough of Lewisham.

Exemption is also provided for any vehicle being used in connection with the removal of any obstruction to traffic; the maintenance, improvement, reconstruction, cleansing or lighting within the street; the laying, erection, alteration in or adjacent to the street of any sewer or of any main, pipe or apparatus for the supply of gas, water or electricity, or of any electronic communications network [within the meaning of the Communications Act 2003], or the placing, maintenance or removal of any traffic sign in the street.

3. The order comes into force on the 26th October 2020 to remain in force for up to 18 months.

4. The prohibitions apply as, when and to the extent signed on the highway.
