The proposed works are to refurbish the basketball courts on Clapham Common adjacent to Rookery Road in partnership with Basketball England, NBA and Foot Locker.

The refurbishment includes the installation of galvanised steel seating blocks for up to 240 spectators. The

steel seating blocks for up to 240 spectators. The suggested seats will be bolted to the ground but can be re-lifted and repositioned. The seating will be custom built with dimensions as follows, 1.9m wide \times 1.3m height \times 20m length along the court side and on each end of the court seating blocks will be 10m length \times 1.9m wide \times 1.3m height.

Other works include replacing existing basketball hoops and backboards and to jet wash, clean, prime and paint the surfaces, including line markings and a funder's logo. The painting will predominantly be a blue and black design.

No fencing is included in this proposal, nor would the proposed works interfere with or after the current fencing

already in place around the Sports Zone at the North East of Clapham Common.
