## ROAD TRAFFIC REGULATION ACT 1984

THE A3 GLA ROAD (KENNINGTON PARK ROAD, LONDON BOROUGH OF SOUTHWARK) (PROHIBITION OF MOTOR VEHICLES) EXPERIMENTAL TRAFFIC ORDER 2021

- Transport for London hereby gives notice that on 5th March 2021 it made the above named Experimental Orders under sections 9 and 10 of the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1984. The Order will come into force on 19th March 2021 and may remain in force for up to 18 months.
- on 19th March 2021 and may remain in force for up to 18 months.The roads affected by the Orders are the A3 Kennington Park Road and Penton Place in the London Borough of Southwark.
- 3. The general nature and effect of the Order is to prohibit any motor vehicle from proceeding from Kennington Park Road onto Penton Place.4. Where it appears necessary for certain purposes, Transport for London or any person authorised by them may modify or suspend the Order or
- 4. Where it appears necessary for certain purposes, Transport for London or any person authorised by them may modify or suspend the Order or any provisions in it, while the Order is in force.5. In due course Transport for London will be considering whether or not
- the provisions of the Order should be continued in force indefinitely. Within the period of six months from the coming into force of the Order, or if the Order is subsequently varied by another Order or modified, from the coming into force of that variation or modification (whichever is the latest), any person may object to the making of an Order to continue indefinitely those provisions, Any such objection should be made in writing, giving the grounds on which it is made, and sent to Transport for London, Streets Traffic Order Team, Palestra, 197 Blackfriars Road, London, SE1 8NJ or by emailing trafficordersection@tfl.gov.uk quoting reference NP/REGULATION/STOT/RC/TRO, GLA/2021/0246. Any person wishing to question the validity of the Order or of any of its provisions on the grounds that they are not within the relevant powers conferred by the Act or that any requirement of the Act has not been complied with, that person may, within six weeks from the date on which the Order is made, make application for the purpose to the High

Court.
