

Transport for London Notice

ROAD TRAFFIC REGULATION ACT 1984

THE A5 GLA ROAD (EDGWARE ROAD, CITY OF WESTMINSTER) (TEMPORARY PROHIBITION OF TRAFFIC AND STOPPING) ORDER 2021

1. Transport for London hereby gives notice that it intends to make the above-named Traffic Order under section 14(1) of the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1984 for the purpose specified in paragraph 2. The effect of the Order is summarised in paragraph 3.
2. The purpose of the Order is to enable Mobile Crane lifting works to take place on a section of the A5 Edgware Road.
3. The effect of the Order will be to prohibit any vehicle from:
 - (1) enter, exit or proceed on the southbound carriageway of Edgware Road between its junctions with Old Marylebone Road and Crawford Place;
 - (2) stop in the Loading and Unloading Only Bay outside Nos. 259 - 269 Old Marylebone Road;

The Order will also allow all vehicles to turn right into Sussex Gardens from Edgware Road.

The Order will be effective at certain times from 10:00 PM on 5th September 2021 until 5:00 AM on 6th September 2021 and from 10:00 PM on 3rd October 2021 until 5:00 AM on 4th October 2021 or when the works have been completed whichever is the sooner. The prohibition will apply only during such times and to such extent as shall from time to time be indicated by traffic signs.

4. The prohibitions will not apply in respect of:
 - (1) any vehicle being used for the purposes of those works or for fire brigade, ambulance or police purposes;
 - (2) anything done with the permission or at the direction of a police constable in uniform or a person authorised by Transport for London.
5. At such times as the prohibition is in force an alternative route will be indicated by traffic signs via Sussex Gardens, Westbourne Street and Bayswater Road back to normal route of travel.
