NOTICE OF APPLICATION FOR A PREMISES LICENCE -LICENSING ACT 2003

Notice is given that: Ms Christina Reynolds for and on behalf of the Greenwich Cooperative Development Agency (of charitable status) has applied for the Grant of a Premises

Licence for the following premises: An area incorporating Pegler Square from the entrance of

Kidbrooke Station, from the junction of Plowden Road and Pegler Square Road to Kidbrooke Park Road (A2213).

The event site will continue on the other side of the A2213 from the top of Cator Park North (not including the children's play

park) to the bottom of the park at Weigall Road. The Event space will continue on the east side of the A2213 from the junction of Weigall Road with the A2213 to encompass Cator Park South as far as Cambert Way and Astell Road in the

east to Tudway Road in the south. A record of this application may be inspected by appointment. Other persons may make representations to the Council on this application by no later than Friday 27th May 2022.

Representations can be made in writing, by email or fax using the contact details above. Representations can only be made on the grounds of one of the four licensing objectives, namely:

- Prevention of Crime and Disorder
- Prevention of Public Nuisance
- Public Safety
- Protection of Children from Harm
- Any person who makes a false statement in connection with an

application is liable on summary conviction to an unlimited fine. It is proposed that the following licensable activities will take place at the premises/site on the basis of markets and no more than EIGHT one day events annually: Plays, Films, Live & Recorded Music, Dance, Anything Similar

to Music & Dance (e.g. spoken word, walkabout entertainers). and the On & Off-Sale of Alcohol, between 10:00 hours and 21:00 hours daily. Each of the eight one-day events will usually be held on a Friday, Saturday or Sunday, but "daily" is being applied for to allow flexibility. Off-sales of alcohol are to be taken away from Kidbrooke Village or into homes if purchased by local residents; there is to be no open-air consumption.
