

LONDON BOROUGH OF LAMBETH
AMENDMENT TO PARKING PLACES – TROUVILLE
ROAD

[NOTE: This Notice is about the removal a section of permit holders parking place outside Nos. 29 and 30 Trouville Road and replacing it with single yellow line no waiting restrictions that will operate at Controlled Parking Zone hours to allow for the installation of a dropped kerb.]

1. NOTICE IS HEREBY GIVEN that the Council of the London Borough of Lambeth, on 6th December 2023, made The Lambeth (Free Parking Places, Loading Places and Waiting, Loading and Stopping Restrictions) (Amendment No. 36) Order 2023 and The Lambeth (Charged-For Parking Places) (Amendment No. 33) Order 2023, under sections 6, 45, 46, 49 and 124 of and Part IV of Schedule 9 to the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1984, as amended. The Orders will come into force on 11th December 2023.

2. The general effect of the Orders would be to replace a section of permit holders parking place with single yellow line no waiting restrictions that would operate at Controlled Parking Zone hours (Monday to Friday, 9am to 6pm) on Trouville Road, the south-west side, between a point in line the north-western boundary of Nos. 29 and 30 Trouville Road and a point 7 metres south-eastwards of that boundary.

3. The Orders are necessary to accommodate a new vehicle crossover outside Nos. 29 and 30 Trouville Road and prevent obstruction of access.

6. If any person wishes to question the validity of the Orders or of any of their provisions on the grounds that they are not within the powers conferred by the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1984, or that any requirement of that Act or of any instrument made under that Act has not been complied with, that person may, within 6 weeks from the date on which the Orders are made, apply for the purpose to the High Court.
