

# **NOTICE OF APPLICATION FOR A NEW (TIME-LIMITED) PREMISES LICENCE UNDER THE LICENSING ACT 2003**

**Notice is given that the Applicant**, LTA Operations Limited, The National Tennis Centre, 100 Priory Lane, Roehampton, London has applied to the London Borough of Hammersmith and Fulham for a **new Premises Licence** for Queen's Club, Palliser Road London, W14 9EQ (the "Premises" as delineated in the licensing plan), for an annual Women's Tennis Association (WTA) tournament at the Club. The Licence will be time-limited i.e. it will only operate for 9 days per annum, in the run up to the (licensed) ATP tournament at same 'Premises', each year. **The Proposed Activities to be authorised by the new licence:** Mon to Sun: Film Exhibition:10:00 to 22:00, Indoor Sporting events:11:00 to 22:00, Performance of Live Music:12:00 to 17:00, Playing of Recorded Music: 11:00 to 21:00 and the Sale of Alcohol:11:00 to 22:00. Opening hours: Mon to Sun: 10:00 to 22:30. These licensable activities/hours mirror the existing Premises Licence for the ATP tournament (2024/00532/LAPR). The new Licence will also be subject to bespoke licence conditions (which virtually replicate the ATP licence conditions). It is an offence to knowingly or recklessly make a false statement in connection with an application, the maximum fine for which a person is liable on summary conviction is £5000.
